From the Rector

As I write this Spire article, I am aware that I'm enjoying our weather here in Southern California - I get to wear shorts and a Hawaiian shirt. I'm also aware that a significant portion of North America is undergoing brutal freezing weather.

The National Weather Service (my homepage on my internet browser) describes it thus - "One of the coldest arctic air mass intrusions in recent memory is surging south into the Upper Midwest before spreading across much of the eastern twothirds of the country. Through late week, expect frigid temperatures, bitterly cold and life-threatening wind chills, likely leading to widespread record lows and low maximum temperatures from the Upper Midwest to the Great Lakes and Ohio Valley." It goes on to describe just how life-threatening this weather can be.

It's been a long time since I lived in places subject to extreme weather - Needles in the early 1980s and before that seminary in Wisconsin. We lived and worked always factoring in the weather. Extreme weather also impacts buildings necessitating repairs and rebuilding, but even our pleasant weather can exact a toll on buildings. Within the next week we here in Sierra Madre are expecting a series of rain storms. Already this year our church building is feeling the result of wind and rain. And we too will be facing rebuilding and repair of our church roof. Your Senior Warden has more to say about this in his article. But today, I am grateful for our weather here, and I am praying for all those affected by the Polar Vortex.






Ascension Capital Campaign 2019 "Raising the Roof" Continued from Page 1.....

Completing this project will ensure that our Sanctuary will be ready for the next rainy season while preventing any further water damage to the property. We have no illusions about the financial challenge that lies before us, but we also know that our community has risen to the occasion before and done great things when called upon.

We also know that completing this effort so quickly may seem like a lofty goal; but we are inspired by the vision of our church having a secure roof, a dry sanctuary, and a completed and fully funded project. "Gracious God, be in that grace filled silence that lies deep within me, that I may live in Christ as Christ lives in me."


What is truly worthwhile is not always easy. Taking our lives and relationship with God to the next level all too often demands letting go and recreating ourselves.

February 24 ~






