## From the Rector

As the New Year approaches, I have decided to reflect a little on what I learned in 2021. It certainly wasn't the best year of my life, but I can't say it was all bad either.

2021 taught me the need to be flexible in planning for worship and community life. We had to pivot from worshipping outside to being back inside and just online. And then we resumed outside worship and then moved to in-person worship inside. And all the while, we were keeping the online option going. At last this past Christmas somewhat approximated what we knew and loved from worship before COVID.

I also learned that even if you avoid COVID, something else can get you. In my case, it was the infections that led me to be hospitalized in April and May. Like with "long – COVID," I have some residual challenges – mainly nerve pain from the surgery I had and fatigue. During my illness, I learned how much I can rely on my colleagues. Pastor Josh, Deacon Ed, and Dr. Deb kept our worship life going. Our Senior and Junior Wardens – Gordon and Ray, Kim our Parish Administrator, and Jean Rowe kept our community life together.

The realities of 2021 taught us that we can think outside of the boxes we constructed and thought were immutable. For example, having to postpone the 2021 Parish Annual Meeting gave us freedom to realize that the Annual Meeting doesn't "have" to be held the last Sunday of January. This year we've scheduled it for the last Sunday of February.

Finally, 2021 taught us that vaccines and boosters work and that we will be able to reclaim our lives.

I pray that 2022 will be better for all of us. I know that I am already anticipating the joy of having a new baby in our family when our granddaughter is born in January. I'm sure that learning how to grandparent will be a lesson in 2022.

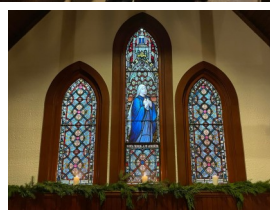
## Memorial Garden Update
