It is unusual in the Episcopal Church for a priest to serve in one congregation for over thirty years. There are disadvantages – just ask my successor in a few years. But for me, the blessings come in knowing families over generations. I have the privilege of being included in burials, baptisms, weddings, anniversaries, graduations, divorces and remarriages, illnesses, and all of the life events that mark our lives together. Forty years into this deal, I am very grateful.

I have no idea. Well, maybe I do. If you were offered the opportunity to sit down with God, let's say over coffee, and have a heart-to-heart chat, would you accept the invitation? You bet you would...who doesn't have something to say to God. Sometimes, we confuse talking to God with prayer – another subject for another time. The point is that if we listen to each other without judgement, just listen, and experience everything around us without judgement, and just see life for what it is and not for what we expect or even want it to be, I suspect we'll experience God in wonderous and new ways, talking and listening to us ever so attentively.

Solutions, God's solutions are right there in the midst of it all. Remember God is a master of disguise! So, stop looking and wondering what he's up to and remember to always thank God for all that is happening at this time and place in your life because rest assured, he's in the middle of it and is doing and saying something.
